Workshop in Valletta, Malta October 25th, 2018

This first workshop will be part of the Valletta 2018 conference "Sharing the Legacy", where the European Capital of Culture will trace routes and explore paths for their legacy. One such path leads to promoting the role of culture for urban nature around the Mediterranean.

The workshop is divided in two parts. The first part is a site-specific, collaborative transdisciplinary exercise about the new rooftop garden that will be created on the Valletta Design Cluster [VDC], on the Biccierija building. The process around the rooftop garden involves a panoply of stakeholders, local and international, across a range of disciplines. It will also be a beta-test of Growing Pathways's site-specific transdisciplinary tool.

The second session will produce a first visual overview and idea of the scope and potential of the MUNIN network. We will run a cultural mapping exercise before and during the workshop to have input from both workshop participants and other potential members of the MUNIN network. By sharing their practical interventions and research, the participants will map culturally intervening agents involved in developing the role of urban nature in cities around the Mediterranean.



Conference: The Valletta 2018 conference is the fifth of its kind, arranged by the European Capital of Culture for 2018, Valletta, Malta. The aim for this year is to share reflections on the fundamental question of "What makes a city better?". This reflection aims to understand how cities can be shaped to better suit the needs and desires of the individuals and communities that it hosts, whether on a permanent or temporary basis." Moderators: Growing Pathways is a transdisciplinary agency exploring and documenting the pathways to a healthier human/nature relation with a particular focus on cities and nature-based liveability. Since 2015, we have worked with public and private partners from Denmark and Europe, forging a unique niche drawing on future-oriented creativity and scientifically endorsed fieldwork and action-research.

The workshop will be facilitated by PhD, Action-philosopher, Oleg Koefoed, and is planned in collaboration with Caldon Mercieca from the Valletta Design Cluster, Greta Muscat Azzopardi from The Amber Spark, and with substantial help from a team from the Worchester Polytechnical Institute.
