1ST CALL FOR PROPOSALS EVALUATION RESULTS

November 2018 - **Culture at Work Africa**, co-funded by the European Union, announces the evaluation results of its 1st Call for proposals.

Of the 253 applications submitted within the deadline, 139 proposals complied with the eligibility criteria and were therefore assessed by the Culture at Work Africa Project Steering Committee.

At the end of the assessment process, 15 projects have been selected for the award of the subgrants:
